DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This low-rise, horizontal residence is graced by sensitive landscaping amenities. Faced in squared rubble stoned, the house is defined by the interplay of several shingled roof sections and diagonal roof sections.

The left section is almost entirely hidden by shrubbery. Three long, narrow juxtaposed windows fill the upper section of the facade. The eaves extend beyond the building walls, accentuating the louvered apex of the roof, which angles into a slope.

In the central section the eaves again extend beyond the building walls, forming a walkway/porch. The 2 diagonal roof supports are based in stone shrubbery containers. The facade beyond these supports also holds 3 horizontally rectangular windows. To the right is the entrance, a simple, wooden door flanked by opaque glass panels and mounted by an opaque glass transom.

The right section lacks a porch; containing instead a bipartite window group. Separated by mullions, the left section holds double casement windows with single lights, both of which are underlined by a horizontal rectangular glass pane. The right section consists of a single, fixed pane. The roof evolves into a minor gable with a louvered apex.

A wide rubble stone chimney saddles the roof at mid-section.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Rooflines and interior space use define this low-rise residence built along "Wrightian" lines. Careful landscaping brings exterior space inside while providing privacy.

This style became popular during the late 1950's. Though unique to Ashburton, Mt. Washington's "~~The~~ Terraces", is built almost entirely in this style.
