## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This 2-story stucco mid-block residence is asymmetrically massed. Angular building lines contrast with the rounded lines of windows and porch openings. When synthesized with the painted beige facade and the Spanish tile roof, the result is architecturally unique.

Three stone steps lead to the front porch. The lines of the left side of the porch building walls are straight, while on the right side, the interior and exterior walls are curved. The wall holding the door is recessed from the main facade; the door itself is round headed and composed of several rows of lights. The 2nd floor of the recessed wall carries round-headed double casement windows underlined by a brick header sill.

The left facade holds a bipartite window grouping separated by a wooden mullion. The rectangular windows underlined by brick header sills each carry 3 vertical rows of 5 lights. The method of opening is not determinable. Two single versions of this grouping fill the 2nd story facade.

The facade turns at an oblique angle to the northern side. Here the roof projects beyond the building wall and must be supported by an angled wooden beam. A round-headed French window in the first floor is mounted on the 2nd floor by 2 rectangular windows identical to those in the 2nd floor front facade.

The right bay extends beyond either front building walls. The door and 2nd floor balcony entrance are enclosed by stucco walls with a round-headed entrance on the first floor and a round-headed brick sill opening in the upper section of the balcony.
