DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two bay, three story house with basement stands at the end of a row. It is built of brick laid in running bond, and has a rear-sloping, shed roof.

The brick base is fronted by a flight of 5 wooden steps which run to the off-axis entrance. The steps are flanked by a small basement window on the left and a round arched airy-way entrance on the right. All windows and the entrance-way are segmental arched.

The windows are proportionately scaled as they rise on the facade. All have wooden sills, segmental arched brick lintels, and are filled with double hung windows with 2/2 lights. The doorway is filled with a wooden screen door with a solid wooden door behind. A rectangular transom rests above. The door sill is of wood.

A freize of brick is defined by a string molding which runs beneath the cornice. Three slim wooden brackets support the cornice. Jigsawed wooden ventilator grilles are set in the 2-section freize. The grill on the right has been filled with a solid piece of wood. The slim cornice is jigsawed with lacy abstract ornament.


