The small two story plus attic, two bay wide brick houses built along this side of Churchill St. (114, 118, and 120 Churchill St.) were built in the 1840's by the owners of the lots to the rear facing on Montgomery St. 126-128 Churchill St. is a three story, shed-roofed former warehouse building now converted to residences, each two bays wide. The building was constructed in the 1870's by William Armstrong and John Denny to serve as storage space for their cabinetmaking and undertaking business located at the north-east corner of Light and Montgomery Streets (now 717 Light St.)

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This three story brick house with gable roof is one of the tiny alley houses that once served as homes for the servants of the more well-to-do inhabitants of Montgomery and William Streets.

The house is three stories in height, about 15' wide, and occupies a lot about 50' deep. The house is two rooms deep. There are no rear additions. The house is constructed in running bond. The low-pitched gable roof has a double rectangular chimney located at the center of the gable at the west end of the house. A simple, two-tier brick cornice extends across the facade.

The door and window openings all have flat wood lintels and wood sills. All of the window openings are filled with new 6/6 sash. A modern six panel door is recessed slightly , forming a shallow entryway. There is no transom. The entrance is at sidewalk level.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

See under 114 Churchill St.

This house was probably built by Langley Culley, the builder of 119 E. Montgomery St., at the rear of whose lot this house was built. It is slightly larger than its neighbors, being a full three stories in height, but like them was obviously designed for working class tenants. As with most of the alley houses along this block of Churchill St. is has recently been renovated.
