DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story gable roofed house is one of the tiny alley houses that once served as homes for the servants of the more well-to-do inhabitants of Montgomery and William streets.

The house is two stories in height, about 12' wide, and occupies a lot 57' deep. The main house is only one room deep, under a steeply pitched gable roof covered with asphalt shingles. There is a single roof dormer. A tall, double hooded chimney rises along the east side of the roof. There is a simple, two-tier brick cornice. The house is constructed in common bond.

The door and window openings have flat wood lintels and sills. All of the window openings are filled with new 6/6 sash. There is a modern six panel door set beneath a three-light transom. The house sits on a low basement, the entrance being reached by two marble steps. A rectangular coal opening is located to the left of the steps. The house is set back from the street and has a small front yard with an iron fence.






