DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This group of two story brick houses with gable roofs are the only survivors of a row of such houses that were built in the 1840's and extended along this side of Olive St. 1009 Olive has been stuccoed and 1013 Olive has been covered with asbestos shingles, The first floor areas of both houses have been converted into garages.

The house are two stories in height, 15' wide, and occupy lots 41' deep. They are constructed in common bond. The low-pitched gable roofs have two-tier brick cornices. Each house had a single rectangular chimney located along both the front and rear roof gables, on the south side of the house.

1011 Olive St. is the only house in the group with its original lintels and sills exposed to view. The first story door and window openings have splayed brick lintels; there are no lintels on the second story openings. The sills are wood. The window openings at 1009 and 1011 Olive are boarded over; those at 1013 Olive are filled with 6/6 double hung sash. 1011 Olive has a modern flush door set beneath a single light transom. There is no basement and the entrance is reached by one stone step.




