The entire south side of the unit block of E. Hamburg St. (except for 3-7 E. Hamburg St., west of Patapsco St.) is improved with groups of two and a half story, late Federal style brick houses built in the late 1830's and early 1840's by John S. Gittings and several other local carpenters to whom he sold lots. 3-7 E. Hamburg St. are two story, two bay wide gable-roofed brick houses built in the 1850's for working class tenants. They are quite similar to other two story houses lining Patapsco St. just to the south of these houses. A number of houses on this side of Hamburg St. are currently being renovated.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This group of three two story brick houses with gable roofs and front and rear roof dormer windows was built in the 1830's and formed part of a group of such houses extending along this side of Hamburg St. 27 and 29 Hamburg have been covered with formstone and 25 Hamburg has a new first floor window.

The houses are two and a half stories in height, about 12 1/2' wide, and occupy lots about 71' deep. Each house is two rooms deep and was built with no rear additions. Today, 25 Hamburg has a one story high, three bay deep new frame addition; 27 Hamburg has a one story high, two bay deep frame addition; and 29 Hamburg has a one story high, two bay deep frame addition which is extremely deteriorated. The houses are constructed in running bond but 27 and 29 Hamburg have been covered with formstone. The steeply pitched gable roofs have a two-tier brick cornice. Each house has a front and rear roof dormer window. The gable roofs are covered with asphalt shingles. Each house has a double rectangular chimney located on both the front and rear roof gables on the west side of the house, except for 27 Hamburg where the rear roof chimney is a single chimney.

At 25 Hamburg St. all of the door and window openings have common arch brick lintels with scroll-sawed tympanums. There are no sills. The first floor window has been replaced by a new multi-light window. At 27 and 29 Hamburg St. the formstone covering hides the original treatment of the door and window lintels and sills, but it appears that the lintels are flat. All of the window openings are filled with 1/1 sash, except for the first and second floor windows of 27 Hamburg which are filled with a 6/6 sash. 25 Hamburg St. has a glass and panel door with mutli-light upper panel; 27 Hamburg has a glass and panel door; and the doorway of 29 Hamburg is currently boarded. Each door is set beneath a single light transom. The houses sit on fairly low basements, the entrances being reached by three brick steps at 25 Hamburg and by two stone steps at 27 and 29 Hamburg St. Each house has a rectangular coal opening located beneath the first floor window.






