The majority of houses along the west side of this block of Patapsco St. are small, two story, two bay wide gable-roofed brick houses built in the 1850's to provide inexpensive housing for the growing numbers of new workers arriving in the area, many of whom were recent immigrants. A number of these houses have recently been renovated and now serve a mixed commercial/residential use. 1000 Patapsco St. has been remodeled as a two story, shed roofed house with bracketed cornice; 1026 and 1042 Patapsco St. are two story plus attic, two bay wide brick houses. The houses along Patapsco St. were generally built by the owners of the houses located on the western sections of the lots, facing on S. Charles St.

 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story plus attic brick house with gable roof was built in the late 1840's-early 1850's. It is currently empty and awaiting restoration.

The house is two and a half stories in height, about 14 1/2' wide, and occupies a lot 48' deep. The house is constructed in common bond. The low-pitched gable roof has a two-tier brick cornice. The house is two rooms deep. There is a double rectangular chimney located along both the front and rear roof gables on the south side of the house.

All of the door and window openings originally had flat wood lintels and wood sills. Only the second story and attic windows remain, the first floor window having been bricked over. All of the window openings are currently boarded. The door area has been enlarged and there is now a pair of metal doors leading to a storage area beyond, in place of the original door. The entrance is reached directly from the sidewalk.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is significant as being a surviving example of the type of small two story plus attic house that was built along narrow alley streets in the 1850's to provided inexpensive housing for the influx of newly arrived residents to the area seeking work in harbor-related activities. This type of alley house is much larger and more commodious than the two story, gable-roofed type built contemporaneously along Patapsco St., as it is not only an extra half story in height, but also is considerably deeper.

The house was built on the rear of the lot belonging to 1047 S. Charles St., probably by the owner of the Charles St. house who then rented the alley house to a succession of tenants. See under 1047 S. Charles St.
