The eastern end of the north side of Poultney St. was the first section of the block to be developed residentially, the western side being the site of a cooperage business until the 1870's. 40-46 Poultney St. are all two story plus attic, two bay wide brick houses, built between 1850 and 1857. Only 46 Poultney St. retains its original gable roof, the roof lines of 40-44 Poultney St. having been remodeled to resemble shed roofs and bracketed cornices added. 38 Poultney St. was built in 1857 as a three story, two bay wide brick gable-roofed house, but it too now has a shed roof and bracketed cornice. At the western end of the block, the group of two story, two bay wide brick houses with shed roofs and original bracketed cornices (now gone) at 10-22 Poultney St. was built in the early 1880's by two different local builders. 24-26 and 34-36 Poultney St. are pairs of two story, gable-roofed houses built in the 1870's; 28-32 Poultney St. is a group of two story, two bay wide brick houses with shed roofs and a continuous bracketed cornice, built in 1870.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This pair of two story, two bay brick houses with shed roofs was built in the early 1880's as part of a group of such houses extending between 10 and 22 Poultney St. Both houses have been covered with formstone.

The houses are two stories in height, 20 Poultney is 13 1/2' wide, 22 Poultney is 14' wide, and both occupy lots about 64' deep. Each house has a two story high, one bay wide and deep stair hall extension which connects the main house to a two story high, two bay deep rear addition, followed by a two story high, one bay deep frame addition. The houses are constructed in running bond but the facades have been covered with formstone. The shed roof has no cornice at 22 Poultney but 20 Poultney has a wooden cornice which is probably original to the house. It consists of a deeply projecting crown molding supported by a row of grooved modillions and a lower molding strip. Two grooved end brackets frame and support the cornice. 22 Poultney has a single hooded chimney located on the west side of the rear section of the roof. Each house also has a hooded rear end chimney located at the north end of the rear addition.

Although the original treatment of the door and window lintels and sills has been hidden by the formstone covering, it is apparent that the lintels were flat, probably splayed brick. All of the window openings are filled with 1/1 double hung sash. 20 Poultney has a panel door with upper lights; 22 Poultney has a multi-light glass and panel door. Both doors are set beneath single light transoms. The houses sit on fairly high basements, the entrances being reached by three steps each, stone at 20 Poultney, and brick at 22 Poultney. Each house has two rectangular basement openings located beneath the first floor window, one of which was originally a door set below the level of the sidewalk, leading to the basement.




