The west side of the 1100 block of Light St. was originally improved with groups of three story, gable-roofed brick houses built in the late 1840's and early 1850's to serve as combination residential/commercial structures. 1102, 1104-1106, and 1116 Light St. survive in close to their original exterior, gable-roofed form, although all have modern storefronts. 1100 and 1114 Light St. were enlarged and remodeled after the Civil War and are now three stories in height with shed roofs and bracketed cornices. 1130 Light St. is an elaborated designed and decorated, somewhat Moorish style commercial structure, three stories in height, three bays wide, constructed in brick with brownstone and cast iron trim. The building was built in the late 1880's by Joseph and Bernard Harig to serve as a hardware store. The remainder of the block is now occupied by modern, two and three story commercial structures.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This three story, two bay brick house with gable roof was built in the 1850's and formed part of a row of such houses extending along this side of Light St. The first floor area has been converted into a store-front, which serves as part of the retail area of 1100 Light St.

The house is three stories in height, 15' wide, and occupies a lot 68' deep. The house is constructed in running bond. The low-pitched gable roof has a two-tier brick cornice.

The second floor window openings have no lintels; the third floor window openings have molded wood lintels (a piece of crown molding) similar to lintels on houses on the unit block of Cross St. All of the sills are wood. All of the window openings are filled with new 6/6 sash. The first floor area has been converted into a store-front in conjunction with the store-front at 1100 Light St. The entire facade area has been faced with new brick and there are two plate glass windows set beneath panels of aluminum siding. The entrance is located at 1100 Light St. An aluminum sign extends across the entire width of both store-fronts.

This house, and the neighboring house at 1100 Light St., were built by August Pfeil, who had a tobacconist's shop at 1100 Light St. and lived at 1102 Light St. Pfeil remained in business at this location through the 1870's.¹




