The west side of the 1100 block of William St. is improved with several different groups of two and three story houses. At 1122-1124 William St. there is a pair of three story, two bay wide brick houses with shed roofs and bracketed cornice, built in the late 1850's or 1860's. Adjoining to the north, at 1114-1120 William St., is a group of three story, three bay wide brick houses with gable roofs, built about 1855 by Conrad Linderman, a local baker. The houses at 1102-1106 William St. are a group of late Victorian style, two story, two bay wide brick houses with shed roofs and bracketed cornices, built in the late 1870's. A house originally similar to the previously mentioned row, at 1100 William St., has recently been renovated with a totally rebuilt facade. The present structure is a two story, three bay wide brick house with shed roof and simple brick cornice, with a first floor storefront area designed in a traditional or "colonial" manner, with central door flanked by multi-paned shop windows.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This row of two story, two bay brick houses with shed roofs and bracketed cornices are the second group of houses to occupy this site, replacing gable roofed houses that were built prior to 1850. 1104 and 1106 William St. have been covered with formstone.

The houses are two stories in height, 11' wide, and occupy lots 56 1/2' deep. Each house is two rooms deep and there are no rear additions, except for a second story, one bay deep frame addition at 1102 William that projects outs over the rear yard. The houses are constructed in running bond but 1104 and 1106 William have been covered with formstone. The shed roofs originally had a continuous cornice consisting of a deeply projecting crown molding supported by a row of modillions bordered by a row of quarter-round carvings. Three elaborate brackets per house supported the cornice and connected it to a lower molding strip. The brick freize area thus formed was punctuated by two scroll-sawed ventilating panels per house. The cornices at 1104 and 1106 William St. are missing and at 1102 William the lower molding strip and the northernmost bracket are missing. Each house has a double chimney located along the north side of the center section of the house. At 1102 William the chimney is covered; at 1104 William it is flat; and at 1106 William it is hooded.

All of the window openings originally had segmentally arched brick lintels with scroll-sawed tympanums and wood sills. These still exist at 1102 William but the scroll-sawed tympanums have been replaced by solid wood tympanums at 1104 and 1106 William. The window openings at 1102 and 1106 are filled with 1/1 double hung sash; those at 1104 are filled with the original 4/4 double hung sash. The doorway has an elaborate brick doorframe consisting of an arched brick hood with a row of stepped bricks along the inner edge. 1102 William St. has a late Victorian glass and panel door; 1104 William has a modern flush door; and 1106 William has a Mission-style door. All of the doors are set beneath single light transoms. The houses sit on high basements, the entrances being reached by five wood steps at 1102 William, six wood steps at 1104; and six brick steps at 1106 William. Each house has a small square coal opening with metal cover located to the right of the steps. Each house also has a door set below street level, leading to the basement, located directly under the front door.




