The east side of the 1100 block of Riverside Ave. is improved with a variety of house types dating from the late 1830's to the 1880's. The earliest houses on the block are at the north end and consist of a group of two story, two bay wide gable-roofed brick houses built in the late 1830's by William Gist (1109, 1111-1113) and Isaac Vincent (1115-1117). 1109 Riverside Ave. was remodeled after the Civil War and now has a shed roof and bracketed cornice, but the pairs of houses at 1111-1113 and 1115-1117 Riverside Ave. retain their original exterior form. At 1119 Riverside Ave. there is a two story, two bay wide shed-roofed house with bracketed cornice which represents a later remodeling of an original 1850's house built on the site by Vincent. Farther to the south, at 1129 Riverside Ave. there is a similar two story, two bay wide brick house with shed roof and bracketed cornice built in the 1870's. At 1131-1143 Riverside Ave. there is a row of three story, two bay wide brick houses with shed roofs and bracketed cornices, built as a group by Jacob Funk in the early 1880's.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This pair of two story, two bay brick houses with gable roofs were built as a unit in the 1850's as part of the development of this side of Riverside Ave.

The houses are two stories in height, about 12 1/2' wide, and occupy lots 114' deep. Each house is two rooms deep and has a two story high, three bay deep rear addition followed by a one story high, one bay deep frame section. The houses are constructed in running bond. The low-pitched gable roof has a simple brick cornice. There are no extant roof chimneys.

The first and second floor window openings have splayed brick lintels and wood sills. All of the window openings are filled with 1/1 double hung sash. Both houses have Mission-style doors set beneath single light transoms. The houses sit on very high basements, the entrances being reached by seven wood steps at 1117 Riverside, and by a flight of modern metal steps at 1115 Riverside. Each house has a tall basement window opening located beneath the first floor window and undoubtedly originally had a door leading to the basement, set below the sidewalk level beneath the front door.

This pair of houses represents another version of the two story, gable-roof type built next door at 1111-1113 Riverside Ave. In these houses the kitchen is located in the high basement instead of in a rear addition. The houses were built by Isaac Vincent, who also built similar houses at 401-407 E. Cross St.¹



