DESCRIPTION:

The late nineteenth century two-story brick rowhouse has an early twentieth century upper facade. The storefront has a recessed center entry with flanking display windows which are boarded. The storefront cornice is small and bracketed above an apparent sign panel or transom over the projecting display windows. The upper story has a pair of one/one windows and a corbeled brick cornice. The roof is flat.



The small storefront building exemplified by 610 North Chester Street is typical of the commercial district around the Northeast Market. The alteration of the facade was also a common practice. The upper facade is similar to 614 North Chester, which, like 610, was owned by the Roth family, whose various occupations included printing, magazine publishing, house furnishings, a cigar store and a pet shop, located at different times in the early years of the century at 610, 614, and 636 N. Chester St. See also B-4277, 614 N. Chester St.


