It appears to have been altered little and retains integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling and association. Though rather severe in design, it retains original embellishments in the form of decorative brickwork and stained glass window. Identical to many of its neighbors, it maintains the rhythm of the streetscape. It is located in an area which CHAP has indicated is potentially eligible as a district.



EXHIBIT 18: 3d. Site Location Map





