Constructed of brick and rising two stories, the Garrett Heights Elementary School exhibits typical features of an education facility of the 1930s. Built in 1932, Garrett Heights displays an "H" configuration with classical revival features in its cupola, pedimented entrances, hipped roof, and water table. The fenestration consists of single double-hung windows as well as groupings of five windows detailed with stone sills and lintels. In 1970, the demolition of the original c.1900 building occurred to accommodate a two story, brick addition on the west elevation.

Lauraville was a streetcar suburb of the early twentieth century. The bulk of the residential stock was constructed by 1935, and consists of American Foursquares, bungalows, and vernacular victorians. In 1900, a small brick school building existed on site. As Lauraville expanded, a larger educational facility was needed. The Garrett Heights School was constructed in 1932 to serve the growing Lauraville Community.


