

4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **No**

Although this continuous block of six houses (now apartments) has some flaking stone and looks somewhat rundown, the overall effect is one of elegance. These three story brownstones have richly bracketed (Italianate Victorian) doorways, window moldings, and cornice; the windows are proportioned, and the first story windows have delicate wrought iron balconies. All had wrought iron fences originally and the stone fence posts remain. The whole block is extremely attractive (most attractive part of Franklin Square) and is reminiscent of houses in Old Brooklyn Heights (a National Historic District) and parts of Chelsea (West 23rd Street) in New York City.




