




**Built concurrently with St. Luke's at the opposite corner of Franklin Square, this former Methodist church has a Gothic perch similar to that on St. Luke's, but here most of the decorative features are Romanesque — especially the use of round head windows (buildings are similar enough to suggest the same architect). Rough masonry on the south wall (not intended to be seen ?) is more appropriate to Romanesque feeling than the more dressed stone of the facade. There is a steep gable (toward the street) topped by a modified Celtic cross. The facade has a rose window of cast iron. Building has been remodelled on the interior and contains a basketball court, game rooms, showers, and a library. Good example of adaptive preservation and as an important visual landmark of the Franklin Square area, should be preserved.**
