An unusual feature in this two-story frame house is its two front doors, one leading into each room. This section of the house is four bays wide by one bay deep, followed by a kitchen addition. The house rests on a stone cellar which is fully exposed at the rear. A fine late Victorian mantel is among the surviving woodwork.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

120 Chesapeake

The floor plan of this two-story frame house consists of two rooms in the main house followed by a perpendicular kitchen wing. The entire house is situated over a stone cellar, which because of topography, is fully exposed under the kitchen. There is an exterior entrance to the south, and an interior entrance under the main stair. On the first floor of the house, stove flues rise against the south wall of the kitchen and the central partition of the main house. The stair is located along the south wall of the west room.

A mantel in the east room is detached from the present stove flue. The mantel shelf has a chamfered edge and is elaborately shaped in plan. The shelf support is finely cut and employs a quirk ogee chamfer molding. The architraves, with a curved center flanked by double beads, end in concentric circled corner blocks. The exterior architraves consist of narrow beaded strips. The four-panel doors have shallow panels.

On the facade, a 2/2 window and a door once served each room. The east door is now blocked from the exterior. Two 2/2 windows light the second floor. The gable roof of the main house runs east-west, paralleling the street. A semi-enclosed porch has a shed roof supported by turned posts. The porch brackets feature a curved saw-tooth design. The house is covered in asbestos shingles.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Records indicate that this structure was shown in early maps of Towson (Bromley 1898-1915). The earliest deed found indicated that the Towson Real Estate Company conveyed the property to Sarah Hosmer in 1907. In March of that same year the property was obtained by Louis Davis. Louis Davis lost the property in 1946. The property was then purchased by Dawson Groom and wife - Oct. 10, 1946. On June 11, 1947 Dawson Groom conveyed the property to Russell T. Frazier and wife. Two years later the property was conveyed by Russell T. Frazier and Dorothy Frazier to Harry and Bessie Nasder (Sept. 13, 1949). Eight years later Harry and Bessie Nasder conveyed the property to George Banks - March 16, 1957.
