114 Chesapeake Ave.

This simple frame house resembles its neighbors, 112 and 108 Chesapeake Ave. It is covered with asbestos shingles and rests on a stone cellar. The flat porch roof is supported by three round tapered columns topped with simple molded capitals. A door and window on the first floor and two windows on the second floor pierce the facade. The architraves are narrow beaded strips.
