The earliest deed found indicated that in 1953 this property was owned by Mary A. Stromberg who conveyed the property to James Realty and Company. In June of that same year James Realty and Company conveyed the property to William Hess Fisher and wife. The property was conveyed later to Robert Caldwell (April 12, 1962). Robert and Adelaide Caldwell conveyed the property to Walker and Helen Vaight. Eight years later the Vaights sold the property to Gary B. Gill - April 10, 1972.
