DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>STONECOTE is a two storey, five bay stone house facing south, with (originally) a two storey, two bay, shed roofed rear wing, its lower east wall aligned with the east end of the main house. Traditional in form and in detail, STONECOTE dates from the mid-19th century. Contemporary wings of stone, gray stained wood and glass, designed by Paul Marks of Marks and Cooke, Towson, were added in 1970-1972 to the east, west and north.</p> <p>The principal entrance is centered in the south front; first storey windows are 9/6, second storey 6/6 and all are flanked with louvred blinds. Plain wooden lintels with plain corner blocks support masonry above each opening. The gabled roof extends over the end walls with moderate rake overhangs and an interior chimney of stone rises above each gable.</p> <p>Internally, a center hall extends through the house with a single room on each side. The open stair rises within the hall; its round hand-rail is supported by a turned newel of moderate proportions and by plain rectangular balusters. Architraves generally are of two planes, void of mouldings but for a beaded inner edge. Doors are of four panels. A fireplace is in each room, the mantels having plain pilasters supporting a shelf. The small kitchen fireplace is in the northwest corner, parallel to the north wall. A secondary stair rises enclosed in the south end of the kitchen wing.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Stonecote is a traditional farmhouse of the mid-19th century, with only its smallest details indicating its period. Its kitchen wing, with a shed roof perpendicular to the main house, relate it to several other houses in the region.

Since the house does not show on the 1850 County map, it was probably built by Aquilla Chilcoat in the 1860's. His mother had willed him "all my interest in the farm where he resides..." in 1871. (1)

The additions, reduced in scale, allow the original house to dominate the composition. They are quietly contemporary, using traditional materials, making Stonecote an excellent example of a traditional and contemporary blend.
