DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>Huntly is a two storey, three bay frame house, facing south with a two storey, two bay frame kitchen wing to the north, its <sup>shed</sup> roof perpendicular to the main house, its tall south wall coincidental with the north end wall of the main house. Stone exterior chimneys at each end of the main house are modern, for extensive alterations were made in 1946 by the present owners.</p> <p>Exterior walls are covered with plain weatherboards; cornices and rake overhangs are plain. Windows in the main house are pairs of 4/4 flanked with louvred blinds. A porch within the "L" along the west side of the kitchen wing has been enclosed and has a shed roof. The principal entrance was centered on the south front; it is now in the southernmost bay of the west facade and consists of a pair of original doors, each with three panels with sinkages rather than raises and loose Greek echinus mouldings. A modern bay window occupies the two westerly bays of the south front, French doors the eastern bay. Internally, the plan has been altered extensively but it was a conventional center hall type with a single room on each side. Many original elements remain, reused in new locations; the staircase with its octagonal and turned newel, round rail and tapered round balusters all of mahogany; six-panel doors with top and bottom panels approximately equal, some without mouldings some with loose mouldings.</p> <p>A frame barn on a high stone foundation stands west of the house; its tall upper storey, covered with vertical siding, accessible through sliding doors in its east side. A lower shed roof shelters an entrance to the stalls, their storey extending into the framed structure.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Huntly, a house on a hill west of Butler Road, was built about 1859 by either Dr. James J. Given or his brother William F. Given. Dr. Given lived there with his family as a tenant until 1885 when he received 30 acres and the house as recompense for a debt his now deceased brother owed him. (1) The doctor continued to live there until 1893 when the house was sold out of the family.

The Givens came to Maryland about 1855 from Columbia, Pennsylvania. William F. Given had owned a prosperous lumberyard in Pennsylvania when he decided to move to Maryland. Dr. Given was a practicing physician. The present owners of Huntly believe that there was a small office for his practice in the house before extensive remodeling obscured it.
