DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>The A. W. Brewster House is a mid-20th century house designed by Alexander Shaw, A.T.A., Bel Air, Maryland. Its style is an interpretation of American architecture of the Colonial period; its bodily projecting central bay recalls the 17th century. Of brick, two storeys in height, three bays flank the projecting bay to the right (west), two to the left (east). A one and one-half storey service wing extends northerly beyond the east end and a one storey gable-roof porch projects from the west end. The principal entrance, embellished with a classical wooden pediment supported by pilasters, is in the bay immediately west of the projecting bay. A similar projecting bay is on the south front, its first storey having a bay window. A chimney rises above the gable roof immediately behind the projecting bay and another rises flush with the west gable end. Windows are 8/8 and are flanked by paneled shutters in the first storey, louvred blinds in the second. A small circular window in each gable, including that of the projecting bays, lights the attic.</p>

The house was built for Mrs. John K. Shaw, Jr., and purchased from her by the present owners.
