**BORING MILL (SITE) - 1914 - Ex-14107** Old Hanover Road. (East side of Old Hanover Road, 0.1 mile south of Pleasant Grove Road, north of Boring Post Office, BA 1176). Frame and board warehouse, 16 x 44 feet, functional style, used as an engine-powered feed mill. Gable roofs and cupola-ventilator. Equipped with hoist, loading door, and output spout. Some machinery and belting was intact (1975). Built by Andrew W. Armacost to replace a warehouse dropped from the tax ledger in 1914. Owner: Edgar P. Cullison. Demolished, 1978, burned on May 29 that year by a fire of suspicious origin. There was a 25 hp electric motor and a corn sheller; elevators, etc.

**CULLISON STORE - 18\_\_ - 14101** Old Hanover Road, east side, just south of Boring Mill. Apparently the D. Boring house of 1877 atlas. Three-bay, two-story frame house, with gable roof, end chimneys, full-width porch, tin roofing. Was Boring General Store and Boring Post Office, and still housing a postal station, Cullison's store, and gas pumps (1978). Owner: Edgar P. Cullison.

**PINEY GROVE METHODIST CHURCH AND CEMETERY - 1850 -** (East side of Old Hanover Road at SE corner of Piney Grove Road.) 4929 Piney Grove Road. Small frame church with composition shingles, gable roof; in vernacular style. Shown as "Colored Methodist Meeting House" on 1850 map and as "Cold-Ch." in 1877 atlas.
