Description of Property and Justification: *(Please attach map and photo)*

The Dundalk Shopping Center lies on the east side of Dundalk Avenue running from Shipway on the north to Dunmanway on the south. This early shopping center is grouped in a Tudor-Revival style row of two- and three-story buildings, some with covered walkways. It includes a grocery store, a supermarket, a post office, a bank, a pharmacy, a community hall, the Dundalk Company office, a telephone exchange, the Strand Theatre, a police station, and apartments. (See The Neck, p. 60.) The shopping center consists of four separate structures in brick, plus sections in tan plaster and half-timber, featuring both hip and gable roofing in a complex design.

The Dundalk Shopping Center/Dundalk Commercial Core Historic District is a contributing resource in the Dundalk Historic District, listed in the NR on 12/08/1983. Prior to that listing, the resource was determined eligible through the Federal compliance process (see documentation attached). In as much as the Dundalk Historic District has subsequently been formally listed in the National Register, and the Dundalk Shopping Center is significant within the context of the larger Dundalk Historic District, the prior determination is no longer relevant.
