DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

30 Main Street is a three bay, two story frame structure facing the street to the east. It appears to date from ca. 1900. Its roof is nearly flat, having a very slight pitch down to the rear or west. A one-story concrete block addition extends across its east front and south side and the walls of the original portion are covered with asbestos shingles. Three 6/6 windows are in the east facade of the second story, flanked by modern applied louvered blinds; above is a wide wooden cornice supported by scrolled brackets.

Within, all surfaces have modern finishes and there are no partitions in the first story. The second story was inaccessible. A stone-walled cellar extends beneath it and all visible first floor joists are modern, although most of the cellar ceiling is covered with drywall.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This site has always been a commercial one in Reisterstown. In 1901, the land was purchased by Reuben Berryman from John E. Crout and his wife (NBM 255/132). Apparently he built a store on the site at this time.

In 1926, Berryman deeded the property to Arthur A. Bosley and his wife, Evelyn. Arthur died in 1944 and Evelyn remarried to Lee LeRoy McConville (WPC 627/521).

In 1948, Evelyn A. McConville and her husband sold the property to Town Tavern Realty, Inc. This party sold it to Etta Tendrich in 1953 (TBS 1657/381 and GLB 2414/373).

In 1967, Etta Tendrich sold the property to Ethel Satessky. (4822/32).

The present owner acquired the property in the early 1970's.
