

A single two story frame house which, by virtue of its relatively unaltered appearance and positioning, plays an integral role in the cohesive late 19th century streetscape of Ware Ave. These buildings are still used as residences and as a collection are rare among the many blocks of Fowson that have either been demolished by highrise construction or commercial conversion.

WARE AVENUE

Those individuals who owned small business and who often either owned or rented smaller dwellings in Towson played their part in making this community the important service center that it was during the 19th century. It is fair to say, however, that in its earliest days some areas of Towson were shaped in great part by a handful of large families who owned large amounts of land that they subdivided. Prior to the establishment of the Court House these included such families as the Bosleys, Paynes, Chews and Towsons, as well as the Schmucks and the Shealeys. After the establishment of Towson as the county seat there was a great deal of development, buying and speculation. A group of men from West Chester, Pennsylvania which included John T. Ensor, Amos and John Rutter and David McConhey, are known to have purchased large tracts on both the east and west sides of town in the 1850's, and it was under their influence that so many of our streets and lots took shape.

There was another family who owned a large amount of land on the north edge of town prior to the 1850's and whose holdings eventually played a role in shaping that particular neighborhood. Nathan H. Ware owned land on the north side of West Joppa Road at least as early as 1843. The Zur first map of ten years later shows that "N. H. Ware" also owned an improved parcel on the south side of town, just North of the Bowen House on York Road. The Wares owned the Joppa Road property throughout most of the second half of the 19th century, although by the 1890's this land had been subdivided into lots improved with the frame dwellings that are still there today. It is the history of this family that determined the course of this neighborhood and which lead to its eventual development. That it was developed in the last quarter of the 19th century is evident from the style of the buildings on "Ware" Avenue, and it is through these buildings that that street derives its very specific and individual character. It is one of the few streets left in Towson that exhibits a relatively unaltered genuine Victorian streetscape.

111 WARE AVENUE

Located at 111 Ware Avenue is a gable-end structure featuring a portico-covered entrance and centrally located chimney. The building consists of a main block, 3 bays wide, 1 bay deep and with a projection to the south forming an L-shape.

The north facade consists of the main block, being two storys high and 3 bays wide. The second story features three $4/4$ light windows with louvered shutters. The first floor features a centrally located entrance containing a doorway with transom. Also characterizing the first floor is a centrally located portico, supported by two turned columns and with the floor appearing to rest on the ground. Also visible on this facade are the stone foundation and the presence of asbestos shingles over siding.

The west facade is characterized by the end wall of the main block, containing a single $4/4$ light window located in the gable-end. Also visible is a projecting L of 1 $1/2$ storys featuring a $1/1$ light window with shutters on the first floor and a single light window in the foundation, lighting the basement. An enclosed porch is present in the southern-most bay of the projection, featuring steps to an entranceway and supported by piers covered with rock-faced form stone.

The south facade is characterized by the enclosed porch mentioned before. Visible on this facade also are two large 12 light windows which light the porch itself. Also noted was lattice work which fills the opening present between the form stone covered piers.

Characterizing the east facade are three centrally located $4/4$ windows in the main block. Located in the projection to the south are two centrally located $4/4$ sash windows. Also visible on this facade is a small lean-to like addition on the southern-most end of the facade.





