DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Information provided by the present owners as well as structural evidence suggests that this house is a small 19th century frame dwelling which has seen at least two major additions and renovations.

The original building is a three bay wide, two-story frame and clap-board structure resting on a stone foundation. It faces North on Joppa Rd. It has a gable-end roof with a centrally located chimney, exiting at the ridge, made decorative by a brick corbel. There is a three bay single story porch in the north facade supported by square columns. This facade has 6/6 sash, evenly distributed.

The rock-faced formstone which constitutes the foundation of the south wing suggests that this two-story addition took place in the 1920's. It is two bays in width and an exterior flue-chimney bisects the south end. It is made decorative by a rock-faced formstone cap.

The third and most dramatic addition has been recent when this residential structure became the offices of an architectural firm. A two bay, two story addition with tall modern windows and an enclosed porch of the west side expanded the interior space significantly. The use of wood shingles as the exterior covering and the observance of a two-story limitation, however, keeps the renovated building compatible with its neighbors.





