DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

400 York Road is one of if not the most difficult structures in a complex of buildings that is in itself difficult to describe. What was a pre-1877 L-shaped building with a considerable set-back from the turnpike was added onto and extended to the West by several shopfronts of different periods. The 1877 Atlas shows the long building on this corner as belonging to Dr. R. Willis. Unfortunately it has not been possible thus far in the survey (11/1/78) to do a thorough examination of the interior.

The main block is a large two story frame structure with a gable-end roof. It is three long bays in length and the equivalent of two bays in depth. 6/6 sash windows on the East and West second story are perceived to be the original fenestration. Interior flue-chimneys exit at the ridge on both ends.

At the time of inspection the main block and additions were covered with brown wooden shingles that were covered with aluminum siding in November, 1978.

An interesting style feature of the building is the gallery or sleeping porch on the south end of the building. The porch is partially enclosed by a shingled panel and its roof is supported by a slender doric column.

The shopfronts on York Road obscure the west facade except on the second story. A two story flatroofed addition with 1/1 windows (Towson Restaurant) wraps around the southeast corner and obscures half of the south facade. A shed roofed enclosed exterior stairs provides a second story entrance which appears to have contained living quarters. There are five rooms upstairs which include the addition on the southeast corner. Architrave-like mouldings were observed around the windows and doors as were four-panel doors with metal knobs and floral pattern cast iron radiators.

A shed roofed single story addition extends to the East and obscures half of that facade.


