WILLIS-PHIPPS HOUSE (ANGEL'S GROTTTO) - 1867-1870 - 404 York Road, Towson. Long narrow frame and brown shingled Italianate town house that was originally part of Willis Drug Store complex but was split off in 1920 by sale of house and its 15-foot wide lot to August C. Deichelman by Harry F. Phipps. It then served as Deichelman's dime store. Later called the 404 Lounge. Heavy cornice and bracketing survives on south side wall. False mansard roof added over saloon entrance in 1970s. Minor fire, September 14, 1981.

DUNNING HOUSE, WEST (EDWIN B. TACK, INC.) - 1926 - 110 East Pennsylvania Avenue, Towson. Vernacular style, two-story house, gambrel roof, covered with aluminum siding. Enclosed porch. Rock-faced concrete block foundation. Built 1926 by John M. Dunning along with adjacent corner house; replacement of Jones house in 1898 atlas. Sold to George Kentros in 1936. Now office of plumbing firm. Brown brick veneer added summer of 1979. Owner: Edwin B. Tack, Inc.

DUNNING HOUSE, EAST - 1926 - 112 East Pennsylvania Avenue, Towson. Brown frame and shingle house, two stories, with gambrel roof, vernacular style; enclosed porch; rock-faced concrete block foundation. Twin of

house to west (Tack's). Built 1926 by John M. Dunning, who demolished the Mitchell (later German) house shown here in 1898 atlas. Sold to G.S. Martin, Jr., in 1936. Owner: B. Carson Driggs.
