"We've got to get out and this property was available," said James Rolier, chairman of the Mason's building committee."

As proposed, the 180-seat church building, currently rented to Redeemer Lutheran Reform Church, will be converted into the lodge's main hall. A two-story future addition to the southeast side of the building will add another 4,200 square feet to the facility.

The Lutherans will move out when construction is completed on a church of their own.

But when the Masons appeared recently before the Board of Appeals, they asked for additional time to change the site plan and reconfigure the proposed addition. With the new plan, the Masonic officials say they will not need a setback variance.

Though relocating the addition did not materially alter the rezoning request, the Board of Appeals postponed the hearing on the petition. The new date for the board to hear testimony on the reclassification has been set for Oct. 26.

- 1364 MT. ZION UNITED METHODIST CHURCH - 1886 - 20901 Mt. Zion Road, Freeland vicinity. Congregation began in a log school house before 1830. First church was built in 1856 on land deeded by Isaac Morris. Present church erected on same site in 1886 at a cost of \$3,500. Dedicated by Rev. J. S. Kilgore, September, 1886. Frame church in Victorian Gothic Style with square corner belltower with spire. Colored window panes. Gothic windows; round gable window; gable roof; aluminum siding. Stone foundation. Excellent condition. Also a cemetery.

BA- 1543 HOSHALL-ENGLE HOUSE - 1930 - 19124 Middletown Road, Rayville vicinity. House added to tax rolls as "New 1930." Put up during ownership of Joshua G. Hoshall. Passed to Harry B. Hoshall, 1937. Then to Addie Pearl Molesworth, 194 and to Frederick L. Engle. Bungalow on foundation of rock-faced concrete block. Bracketed eaves. Outside end-chimney.
