DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Milestone No. 42(45) marks Mason and Dixon's 42nd horizontal mile west of the initial stone at the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning point of their West Line. It is the easternmost of the 12 monuments now marking the Baltimore/York county boundary and is an original milestone of 1766 at an original site surveyed and preliminarily marked in 1765.

The area here is rural, gently rolling, dotted with scattered farms, several locally-owned orchards and patches of woodlands. The site is located about 1 mile north-northeast of the small crossroads settlement of Gersuch Mills, Maryland, and about 2 miles south-southeast of the town of Stewartstown, Pennsylvania; about 900' east of the main road; about 6' from the south edge of one of the Blevin orchard service lanes, at the north edge of a sloping deciduous woodland; at a point about 2' above the lane grade, thus somewhat protected from farm machinery. It cannot be seen from West Liberty Road, but is visible from the lane when closeby and vegetation is dormant.

The monument, reset in 1902 during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary, presently stands only about 1' above ground, as compared with the presumably original height of about 3' or more. It is in place, firmly set, and in fairly good condition, though weatherworn and with chips at all corners and edges. As with all original Mason and Dixon West Line monuments: it is an embellished, squared oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top, and was quarried and carved in England. The stone now measures about 11½" wide by about 13½" high above ground on the north side (facing Pennsylvania); the letter P is scarcely discernible and the surface is weatherworn and scarred. The east side measures about 11½" wide by about 12½" above ground; the fluting is weatherworn and only bits of margins remain. The south (Maryland) side measures about 11" wide by about 11" high above ground; the letter M and other embellishments are clear and intact. The west side measures about 11" wide by about 11" high above ground; most of the fluting and margins remain, but the surface is weatherworn. The top planes are weatherworn and barely discernible; no fluting remains.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Milestone No. 42(45) is significant primarily as one of the 111 original Mason and Dixon milestones still standing along the West Line. The site was surveyed and preliminarily marked in 1765, and the monument set the following year, where it remains to this day, although reset in 1902 more securely at the time of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Individually, and as one of the 10 (of 12) original monuments marking the present Baltimore/York county boundary, No. 42(45) also is notable as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures in both counties, visibly identified with our Colonial heritage.


MASON-DIXON WEST LINE: MILESTONE 42 (45)
