DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

By the time of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary, the original Mason and Dixon milestone of 1766 and site marking the 43rd mile west of the northeast corner of Maryland had disappeared. The present monument is an original Mason and Dixon milestone of 1767, brought from Washington County in 1902 and set at a higher more suitable site slightly eastward, but on the survey line, thus appropriately maintaining the visual and actual integrity of the West Line.

The area here is rural, gently rolling farmland, sparsely settled. The site is about 1 mile north-northwest of the crossroads settlement of Gorsuch Mills, Maryland; about 2 miles due south of the town of Stewartstown, Pennsylvania; about 700' east of the main road, in the north edge of a scraggly east-west hedgerow separating the Riefle field on the south from Blevins peach orchard, unfenced on the north. It cannot be seen from the main road, nor easily from the orchard service lane nearby.

The replacement milestone, though optimistically set at a new site believed preferable for its preservation in 1902, is only in fair condition, chipped from lack of protection from farm machinery and standing only about 8" above ground level, neglected over time, and the top further damaged in 1933 when the USC&GS triangulation station disk was set into the apex. As with all original Mason and Dixon West Line monuments: it is an embellished, squared oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top, quarried and carved in England. Although about 4' long originally, it was set to stand about 1½' above ground, and was surrounded by a concrete collar below ground. It now measures about 11¼" wide by about 7½" high above ground on the north side facing Pennsylvania; the P is discernible but all other embellishments are gone. The east side measures about 11" wide by about 5" above ground; all fluting and margins are gone. The south side facing Maryland measures about 11" wide by about 10" high above ground; the M is clear; the circle panel barely discernible; and the fluting and margins are gone. The west side measures about 11½" wide by about 9" high above ground; all fluting and margins are gone. The top, rather than rising another 2" to an apex is now a depression, with no planes or fluting remaining, and the metal USC&GS disk cemented into the center.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Milestone No. 43(46) is an original Mason and Dixon milestone of 1767, brought from Washington County in 1902 at the time of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary to replace the original which by then had disappeared. Set on the Line at a new site nearby to the east, it is primarily significant as one of the 111 milestones still standing along the West Line, as well as one of the 10 along the Baltimore/York county boundary. As an individual monument, it is also notable as a visible example of our diminishing Colonial heritage.


