DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

DERRYMORE is a two storey frame house of the Colonial-revival period dating from ca. 1910. Five bays in length with a hipped roof, it is oriented to the road, its principal facade to the east. A one-storey porch shelters the three middle bays of the principal facade and a short two-storey service wing extends west behind the north end. Typical windows are 6/6 with louvred blinds. The principal entrance, with sidelights and transom, is centered in the east front. An interior brick chimney rises between the two rooms which are on either side of the central hall.

In the central hall an open stair rises to the second floor. Most original details remain including the paneled step ends and Tuscan colonette newels and the architraves with a raised bead on either side of a centered sinkage. Mantels are plain surrounds with applied ornament.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

DERRYMORE is a ca. 1910 example of the American Colonial revival, in its simplicity a faithful recall of the original style.

DERRYMORE was part of the Brooklandwood Tract. (See Historic Site Brooklandwood #87). When H. Carroll Brown inherited Brooklandwood from his father, George S. Brown, he built Derrymore as the farm manager's house. It was sold in 1917 to Isaac Emerson and remained in that family until 1951, when E. Loomis, Captain Emerson's daughter sold it to Brooklandwood, Inc.³ In 1955 Brooklandwood, Inc. sold 3 acres to Julie Browne.⁴ In 1966 Mrs. Browne sold it to its present owner, E. Gregory.⁵


