DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The STUMP HOUSE is a one and one-half storey frame house of the early twentieth century Bungalow style. Its principal facade is to the south and the broad gabled roof sweeps down at a slightly shallower pitch to cover a porch which extends across that facade, now enclosed. A broad dormer is centered in the roof, its roof a small gable. A wide shallow bay window projects from the east side, its short walls perpendicular to the main body of the house; its roof is a shed. Exterior walls are covered with wooden shingles. A brick chimney rises through the roof ridge at its mid-point.

In the late twentieth century the south porch was enclosed and a garage was added beneath it, accessible on the falling grade. A concrete block chimney was added to the west end of the enclosed porch to serve a new fireplace there.

The interior of this house was not inspected.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Formerly a cottage of the Chattolanee Hotel, this early twentieth century bungalow is architecturally related to the nearby Loring Cover House (q.v.), also formerly a cottage of the same establishment.

This house was formerly a cottage of the Chattolanee Hotel and was probably built somewhere between 1896 and 1911. When the hotel owned, this house was moved South about 1/2 mile and later moved back to its present location.
