The Wharton house is a two story frame gabled residence three bays wide with additions. The exterior walls are covered with wood shingles; the foundation type was not determined. The main section of the house has a centrally located entrance and is flanked by 9/9 sash windows.

There is a two story addition one bay wide and a $1\frac{1}{2}$ story section with a catslide roof and a large centrally located interior chimney.
