DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The LORING A. COVER HOUSE, formerly a cottage of the Chattolane Hotel, is a frame house of one and one-half storeys in the bungalow style of the early twentieth century. The gabled roof extends down to a point slightly below the second floor line to form a porch across the south front but the north eave is several feet above the second floor line. Walls are covered with wood shingles, curving outwardly above a small cornice at the second floor line. A small two-storey, one-bay-square wing extends from the east gable and a small porch is beneath the west gable. A wide-shed-roofed dormer with a triple window is in the north roof and a recessed dormer is in the south roof. Typical windows are 9/1 with louvred blinds. A modern two-storey wing extends to the south from the southwest corner, two bays in length, with a one storey porch at its south end.

Within is a narrow central hall with an open stair to the second storey; two rooms are on either side. Doors have four partially-raised panels and several types of corner-block trim surround doors and windows. The closed-string stair has a moulded rail supported by turned balusters and newels. The wood mantel of the southeast room (living room) is modern, with pilasters supporting an entablature, delicately detailed in an early nineteenth century mode. A stone-walled cellar extends beneath the entire house and the first floor framing is circular-sawn.

The little east wing contains a small room in the first storey and a bathroom in the second.


