DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Description

Built in 1926 the HOWARD HOUSE is a frame house, five bays in length, two storeys in height, with a gabled roof; its principal facade is to the south although the north is the entrance facade. A one and one-half storey wing is at the east end; joined to its east end via a hyphen is a one-storey wing formerly a free-standing garage north of the house. A two-storey wing is at the west end containing a porch in the first storey, a sun-porch in the second which is supported by Tuscan columns. A small Tuscan porch shelters the south door and one of ornamental cast-iron shelters the north door in a projecting bay. The roofs are covered with slate and three dormers with 6/6 windows are in each slope.

A center hall containing an open stair to the third floor extends through the house and a single room is on either side; the east room (dining room) is shortened to allow a pantry at its north end and the kitchen is in the east wing. Interior detailing recalls a ca. 1800 American period with a slim moulded mahogany handrail on the staircase supported by slim turned newels and rectangular balusters rising above scrolled step ends. Mantels of the two principal rooms recall Adamesque designs with paneled pilasters supporting an ornamental entablature. In the living room the architrave has carved recessed rosettes alternating with stop-fluting while the frieze has swags and rosettes with plain end and center blocks; the fluted dentils have three stacked beads between them. The dining room mantel is similar but simpler with figurines in the end and center blocks.

In the one-storey east wing, connected via a hyphen, is a library having paneled doors with two-plane architraves, paneled chimney breast and architrave fireplace surround, all fully raised, removed many years ago from an unknown eighteenth century house.
