Description

2702 RAILROAD AVENUE is a two and one-half storey house of frame, its exterior walls covered with wood shingles. Two bays in length, a one-storey porch shelters its principal or south facade and a second porch extends across its east end and the east side of its north service wing. A single dormer is in the south slope of the roof and another is in the east slope of the north wing roof. The brick chimney at the west gable has arches sheltering its two flues. Typical windows are 2/2 with louvred blinds. The interior of this structure was not examined.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Significance

2702 RAILROAD AVENUE is a traditional house of the mid-nineteenth century, its design wholly unaffected by current style.

Thomas G. and Sharon D. Supensky purchased the lot of land and its improvements from Gloria Thompson Pinkney, and George W. Thompson and his wife Opal on September 4, 1979.¹ Gloria Thompson Pinkney had inherited two parcels of land from Ella Thompson's estate on February 24, 1971.² Both parcels can be traced back to a deed in 1878 between John Bowen Sr. and wife Catherine of the first part and George and Jarrett Davis of the second part.³ The 1918 tax roll shows that Jarrett Davis was assessed for \$1200 on a lot 550 feet east of the Chattolanes station and \$380 on a house 14 by 24 feet.⁴ In 1896 George and Jarrett Davis held "3 acres on the north side of the Northern Central Railroad near Chattolanee" valued at \$300 with improvements held at 4150.⁵



