DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The FINNEY HOUSE is a two storey frame house consisting of two principal blocks, each with gabled roofs, parallel and joined by a short hyphen of equal length. The principal approach is from the north and the northerly block, two bays in length, is the original; the southerly block dates from the 1950s. Exterior walls of the original section (and of the additions as well) are covered with wood shingles. 6/6 windows have louvred blinds. Detailing is utterly simple and the additions reflect the original. Within the original section are two rooms, extensively refinished in modern times as a kitchen and family room, with a simplicity compatible with the original. In the south wing, now the principal drawing room, is a mantel of ca. 1840 having routed pilasters supporting paneled end blocks which stop a paneled frieze; a deep bed moulding supports a wide shelf.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Formerly a tenant house for Skyfield (q.v.) the FINNEY HOUSE is a simple house dating from the turn of this century with modest additions extending the original simplicity.

In 1924 Mr. and Mrs. Redmond C. Stewart built a small 2-bedroom house which they planned for use as a gardener's cottage for Skyfield. After the death of her husband, Katharine Small Stewart enlarged the Patches to more than double its original size and lived in the cottage. The original structure is now the present kitchen; the original front door is the back door, and with the addition of a tri-level dining room, two living rooms and two large bedrooms, the Patches is now a uniquely charming house.¹ The present owners acquired the house after the death of Mr. Stewart's mother, Katharine Small Stewart.² It is at present rented.
