DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two and a half story frame house is roughly rectangular in shape. The building faces east on Heaverdam Road and is set back on the lot about thirty feet. It is a rectangular lot sloping back toward the quarry. Resting on a stone foundation the house is covered by weathered wooden shingles. The top story has fish-scale shingles, evidence of the Queen Anne influence. The structure has a gable roof with cross gables projecting out slightly at both sides of the house. There is one central chimney.

The second story extends over the first story to form the roof of the one story porch which extends along the front of the house. It is supported by three plain wooden columns with decorative brackets. The brackets are unusual with each containing three negative circles suggesting scroll work. Running along the top of the porch, between the brackets and the second story, there is a narrow wooden trellis.

The second story also has a small, one bay porch over the main door. It is a smaller edition of the main porch with plain columns, brackets and trellis decoration.

The main entrance door located at the north corner of the porch is a wooden door with four vertical panels. The opening is flat with a rectangular transom consisting of two lights. The door opening out on the second story porch is a rectangular, four paneled wooden door topped by a two light, rectangular transom.

There are two, one over one double hung sash windows on the first floor. This is repeated on the second floor where there are two, eleven over one double hung sash windows, again showing the Queen Anne influence. A narrow shingled hood or entablature runs along the top of both windows. In the attic story there is a small central window with a semi-circular arch.

The west end of the building has three over one double hung sash windows on the first story. Steps lead up to a small wooden landing outside of the off center entrance door. The second story has two, one over one double hung sash windows. All of the windows have plain wooden trim.

This west section appears as though it may have been added on a later date. Part of the foundation is brick and there is a line between the two sections of shingles dividing the addition from the main section of the house.

The wooden shingles may have been added on a later point since at several points on the main section beveled siding is visible under the present exterior.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

This building is an integral part of a <sup>19th or early 20th</sup> 20th century streetscape. It is one of the few, one family houses in Texas with elements of the Queen Anne style. The fishscale shingles are unusual along with the brackets on the porch columns.
