DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The LARRIMORE HOUSE is a one and one-half storey log house dating from the first half of the nineteenth century. With its principal facade to the south, closely oriented to the road (Hillside) this house stands at the northeast corner of the intersection of Hillside with Stevenson Road. It is three bays in length and the north slope of its simple gabled roof is raised to a very shallow pitch to cover an addition across its north side. Exterior walls are covered with asbestos shingles. The principal entrance is centered in the south front and a single 2/2 window is in either flanking bay. Two large dormers are in the roof, each with a 2/2 window. Two rooms are within with a straight enclosed stair rising to the second floor between them. The ceilings are quite low. Modern finishes and details cover and replace all original ones externally and internally. The thick walls indicate log construction and the first floor joists are logs, visible in the cellar which is beneath the westerly room.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The LARRIMORE HOUSE is a small log house, dating from the first half of the nineteenth century, a rare survivor of a construction material once common, now very scarce.

This house on the NE corner of Stevenson and Hillside Roads was originally a log house.¹ As assistant to Mr. Wollon, I visited the Larrimore House and was shown the log beams in the basement. At the time the house was build, about 1890, the roads were known as "Stumps or Ridge Road" and Garrison Forest road.² Present owner has lived here since 1942 and over the years siding has been added.
