The Fulton house is a very plain structure in vernacular style built with materials available during the Colonial Revival period, much improved at a later date with contemporary materials. Outer covering is aluminum siding. Chester L. Fulton owned 17 acres at the south end of New Market and tax records demonstrate that this structure was new in 1913. The property remains in the original family. The house is two stories, with a center-hall plan, three bays in front, fitted with a 1-over-1 double-hung sash windows typical of its era. Recent changes include a poured concrete porch deck and wrought iron supports for the porch roof. There is a shed-roofed rear projection or addition.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Fulton House is a two-story frame vernacular style house of very plain but neat appearance, which has enjoyed considerable improvements with currently available materials. It is set close to the road and close to the ground. The house apparently has a center hall plan, the paneled door in the center of its three bays, protected by a contemporary metal storm door with a scalloped frame around its large rectangular glass pane. The windows in front, as well as those on the sides, are double-hung sash types, 1-over-1 in format, typical of the era when the house was built.

The porch is shed-roofed, three bays wide, but not the full width of the house. Porch deck is concrete; the porch supports are four wrought iron columns decorated with scrolls. The porch roof has a visible architrave. The roof is gabled, covered with green rubber roofing tile material. The main roof overhangs at the sides, and extends only slightly over the main facade. There are two inside end chimneys, brick with corbelled tops. The house is two bays deep with two windows at each story, on each end of the structure. Each end of the house has a single, one-pane square window at attic level, set off center (to avoid the chimneys). At the south end of the house is a shallow, one-story, shed-roofed rear projection or addition. The entire house is covered with yellow aluminum siding.

The foundation is stone, not visible on the main facade, becoming slightly exposed toward the rear of the house on the south (or left) side, somewhat more exposed on the north (right-hand) side.

The yard contains a plain, vernacular, vertical board, frame stable, tin-roofed and unpainted; also a small shed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Fulton House is a very plain structure that could be attributed to almost any decade. Chester L. Fulton had 17 acres at the south end of Maryland Line village in the 1911 tax ledger, and kept it intact until 1922, when he sold off some lots that helped fill out the string of houses on the westside of the York Road. (1)

The 1911 ledger was revised by hand in 1913 to reflect a "New Frame House" worth \$750. (2)

The 1918 tax ledger showed the same 17 acres, which adjoined Harry Waltermeyer on the north, with:

This property has not left the original family since the founding of the town. In 1975, Chester S. Fulton conveyed to Chester S. Fulton and Louise T. Fulton. (4) This is the sort of plain house that is found in surveying an entire village.


