This house has been connected with but one family since its construction by Clarence W. Hunt in 1922-1923. This is a sturdy colonial revival house that is well kept and adds to the appearance of the south end of town. It is built on a small, compact scale, 2-½ storeys, two bays wide with a full-width front porch that has been filled in with plate-glass windows to form a sun room. The roof is hipped and its one dormer faces the street with a pair of contiguous, double-hung sash windows of 2-over-1 layout. There is a notable one-story bay window on the south side of the house. Outer wall covering is white aluminum siding. The house is uncomfortably close to the road but screened in part by hedges.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hunt House is a 2-1/2 story Colonial revival house on a small, compact scale, well cared for and presenting a smart appearance as the visual anchor of the south end of town. The house is two bays wide, with a full width front porch that has been filled in as a sunroom with seven large plate glass windows, two on each end, and three in a set north of the door. The outer porch door is of contemporary metal and glass construction, protecting a solid inner door. The porch deck is only one step above grade. The porch supports are no longer visible. There are two windows in the main facade at second-story level, similar to the various side windows, being double-hung sash windows of an unusual 3-over-1 format, the three panes of the upper sash being vertically arranged rectangles.

The only dormer faces the street and has a pair of contiguous 2-over-1 double-hung sash windows. This dormer emerges from the ridge line of the main hip roof.

The north (right-handed) side is three bays, with two large 3-over-1 windows in each bay and a small stairway window of 2-over-2 format in the bay between.

The southside is three bays deep. In the bay nearest the street side is a bay window one story high with its own concrete-block foundation and its own shed roof, containing three full-scale sash windows. The second bay from the street lights the rear rooms, and the third bay contains a slightly recessed first-story side door with six window lights. This side entrance is sheltered by a green and white striped aluminum awning. A flight of nine poured concrete steps with wrought-iron railings leads straight from the side door to the side yard.

The roof is covered with black rubber roofing tiles. The eaves overhang moderately. The only chimney, an internal one, rises through the south surface of the hip roof, located about midway back from the street facade.

Outer wall covering is white aluminum siding; foundation is poured concrete painted white, two or more feet of it exposed along the sides of the house. One rectangular cellar window with three lights breaks the foundation between first and second bays on the southside. The house is uncomfortably close to the road, but screened by some well-kept hedge sections.
