This very large, 2-½ story Colonial Revival house has only had one set of owners, Spurgeon J. Orwig and wife, who had it built in 1932. The house is square, with a side-hall plan, full-width front porch, large, single-sheet sash windows, hip roof, and a dormer facing the York Road. The house is prominently located on the watershed line between two streams and is a prominent feature of the town. Outer wall covering is pebble-studded stucco.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Orwig House is a square, hip-roofed, 2½ story, Colonial Revival house perched prominently on the watershed line along which the turnpike road was laid out. The house is typical of its period, with side-hall floor plan, the main entrance on the left (north).

The house is stucco covered in a pebble-studded grey color, and the porch posts, post supports, and porch railings are also stucco covered. The porch is hip-roofed, full width, with an additional set of full-width awnings (of metal) across the front. The posts are square, of very solid appearance. The porch deck is one step above grade.

The house is two bays wide; on the first story, there is an entrance door with rectangular transom and storm door. A pair of double-hung, 1-over-1 sash windows lights the living room. There are two similar windows, widely spaced, at the second-story level of this main (or west) facade.

The northside is three bays deep, with a side door at ground level and a small stairway landing window in the center bay. The rear bay is fitted with twin, or paired, windows; all sash windows being double-hung, 1-over-1 types as is the case in front. The south facade is two bays deep and contains four single sash windows, similar to all the others. In the southeast corner of the house, facing the rear yard, is a double-decker, recessed porch, sheltered by the main house roof, fitted with railings. A plain narrow cornice runs around all facades.

The hip roof overhangs about one foot beyond the cornice on all sides of the house. A single dormer with twin double-hung, 1-over-1 sash windows faces the street. The stuccoed chimney rises through the rear surface of the hip roof.

The foundation is poured concrete and it becomes more exposed from the street facade to the rear or east of the house. On the north facade, there is a three-light rectangular basement window nearest the street, a six-light basement window under the paired windows at the rear. On the south facade, there are two rectangular basement windows, each with three lights, spaced under the main bays. There is a very prominent and well maintained house. A large metal television receiving mast is located close to the south wall about halfway between street facade and the back of the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This very large, colonial revival house has almost no history, having but one ownership since its construction. The grounds were part of the parsonage property from 1914 to 1921, and after that the short-lived parsonage became home of Mrs. Lizzie Thompson. In December, 1929, Mrs. Thompson, listed as a widow, conveyed a tract on the southside of her large residential lot for \$500 to Spurgeon J. Orwig and wife. (1) In that deed, the York Road was called the Susquehanna Trail, a name that the State Roads Commission had coined for the former pay-road or York and Baltimore Turnpike. The neighbor to the south was Louisa Rosier. Tax ledgers show that a House was added to the Spurgeon assessment account as "New 1932." Assessment was \$1600. (2) This generously proportioned dwelling looks at first glance as if it might be the parsonage for the church across the road, but is entirely private.


