The three-bay porch has battered posts on rock face concrete block piers. The gambrel roof and massive shed dormer are clad by standing seam metal (with snow guards) and the building is clad by vinyl siding. There is a single exterior brick end chimney. Additions to the house include a rear shed addition and a rear wood deck.

According to the building's current owner – Emory E. Leight – the house was built in 1928 by local builder Emory C. Leight. The Leight family has lived in the house since its construction. A common early twentieth century house type, there are no significant distinguishing features in this building and its original fabric has been changed by additions and alterations. This property appears to be not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.



HEREFORD

PRIVATE

The Leight Cottage or bungalow is one of the Dutch Colonial structures dating from Hereford's second spurt of growth early in the automobile era. The house is listed as "New 1929" in a correction made to the tax ledgers, its first owner being Emory C. Leight. This is a 1-½ story structure of frame with aluminum siding. The upstairs space is expanded by a full-width shed dormer. The full-width front porch has a roof formed as an extension of the main gambrel roof. The roof is of standing-seam tin painted green. Foundation is of rusticated concrete block. Windows and porch posts reflect the Colonial Revival period.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Leight Cottage is a 1-1/2 story Dutch Colonial structure of frame and aluminum siding with its upstairs space expanded by a full-width shed dormer. The house faces the westside of York Road from a grass bank. Its full-width front port porch is formed by an extension of the main gambrel roof. The roof is supported by four hollow, tapering, square posts. The porch is five steps above grade, railed with square balusters. The main entrance is in the north bay, providing a side-hall floor plan. The windows at porch in the other two bays are twin double-hung sash types of 6-over-1 layout without shutters.

The shed dormer is two bays wide, housing two pairs of double-hung sash windows of 1-over-1 layout.

The main house is two bays deep in the gable end, with typical windows in all available positions. The south gable peak contains a square window frame fitted with a ventilator.

The rear porch is recessed under an extension of the main roof.

The roof is covered with standing-seam tin, painted green. There is an outside end-chimney at the north end of the house. Foundation is of rusticated concrete block.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Leight house or bungalow is one of the Dutch Colonial structures dating from Hereford's second spurt of growth following the automobile age. In March of 1926, Emory C. Leight purchased 4-1/4 acres from a large local landowner, William C. Johnson (1) The 1923 tax ledger showed that Leight was already a resident and home owner in the village and the 1929-1940 series showed that he added a house, marked "New 1929" to his four-acre site. There was also a garage worth \$100. and an earlier house worth \$1500. (2) The house, a good example of its style and period, is well maintained and still is recorded in the name of the original builder.


