

The Quinn House is a traditional frame structure that fills out the town space in northern Hereford. The house is shown as new in the 1943 corrections to the tax ledger and was apparently built for Emma R. Quinn. Subsequent owners were Harvey M. Martin and Lucy Pauline Joyce. This house is a single story plus attic, built in vernacular style, a small cottage without porches or dormers, with a center hall plan, three bays wide by three deep. The main roof is gabled, the roof over the rear rooms continuing as a shed configuration.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Quinn or Joyce House is an uncomplicated frame structure of one story plus attic, built in vernacular style, a small cottage without porches or dormers. It is three bays wide, its door in the middle bay, producing a center-hall plan. The door is paneled, protected by an aluminum screen door. The flanking windows are 6-over-6 double-hung sash types with louvered shutters. The porch is merely a concrete platform, reached by four poured concrete steps.

The house is three bays deep, the gable ends pointing north and south. On the south end at first-story level, there are two 6-over-6 windows, without shutters. At the second-story or attic level, there is one double-hung sash window of 3-over-1 format, centrally located in the gable pediment. Additional space is provided at the rear of the house by a shed-roofed wing, one bay in depth, fitted with one window of 1-over-1 double-hung sash design.

The north end is only one bay deep, with its single window located at first-story level.

The roofing material is a light green asphalt tile. Outer wall covering is aluminum siding.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Quinn house is one of the traditional frame houses that help fill out the town spaces in Hereford, but it is relatively recent in origin and stands on a lot that is clearly shown to be vacant when George E. Diven sold to Emma R. Quinn in 1941. (1)

The 1942 corrections to the tax ledger showed Emma R. Quinn's lot as vacant, and it was not until the corrections of 1943 that a New House worth \$1700 was added. (2) It was in 1943 that the various Quinn heirs conveyed to Harvey M. and Sarah J. Martin. (3)

Subsequent owners were Harvey M. Martin, alone, and since 1954, Lucy Pauline Joyce, daughter and remainderman of Martin. (4) This plain cottage seems to take the place of two houses, presumably not very durable structures, that were shown in the same general location on the 1877 atlas, designated as property of J. Knight—and, in fact, the present parcel can be traced back to John Knight who acquired the ground at a Sheriff's execution sale in 1874. (5)


