SUTTON HOUSE/ YAREMA HOUSE

1941

HEREFORD

PRIVATE

This Dutch Colonial house stands on one of the early town lots and is the replacement of the former Arnold-Akehurst house destroyed by fire in 1941. The new structure was added to the tax ledger the same year, charged to John W. Sutton. It is of frame, 1-½ stories, gambrel roofed, with a side-hall plan and full-width front porch. The dwelling space upstairs is expanded by a full-width shed dormer, with two pair of double-hung sash windows for lighting. The ends of the house contain both casement and sash windows. The gable peaks contain lunette windows. Main roof is covered with standing-seam sheet metal painted green. Wall covering is wood shingle, painted light green.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Sutton or Yarema House is a modest gambrel-roofed Dutch Colonial cottage set close to the ground on a flat lot, a structure of frame and wood shingles, designed with a side-hall plan. The house stands on the westside of York Road. It is three bays wide at first-story level, two at the second. There is a full-width front porch, its shed roof forming a continuation of the main gambrel roof. The porch deck is wood, reached by two poured concrete steps. The porch roof is standing-seam sheet metal, supported by four square, tapering hollow posts found in Colonial Revival houses. The porch is railed by solid paneling, flush on its sides with the end walls of the main house, covered with wood shingles. The main door is in the north bay, and has two small window lights; the two bays south of it contain 1-over-1 double-hung sash windows.

The second story contains two bays, with paired sash windows of 1-over-1 design set in a full-width, shed dormer.

At first-story level, the south end of the house is four bays deep, containing from front to rear (or from east to west), small casement windows of six lights each, placed on either side of the outside end chimney, and also a 6-over-6 double-hung sash window and, finally, a pair of contiguous 1-over-1 windows set in a filled-in porch recessed under the lower slope of the gambrel roof. The second story on the south end of the house contains two bays, both west of the chimney, containing 6-over-6, double-hung sash windows. There is a lunette in the gable peak. The north end of the house is three bays deep, with two pairs of double-hung sash windows, 6-over-6 in format. There is a centrally located side door (at ground level) and a lunette in the gable peak.

The main roof is covered with standing-seam sheet metal, painted green. The outer wall covering is of wood shingles, painted pale green. Almost none of the foundation is visible from the street.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This Dutch Colonial house stands on one of the early town lots of Hereford, but tax records prove that it is a recent substitute for a house worth \$400 that was charged to Etta S. Arnold in the 1928-1940 tax ledger and transferred to W. D. Akehurst in 1935. (1)

W. Delamere Akehurst and Grace F. Akehurst sold 3/4 acres to John W. and Fairy O. Sutton in 1938. (2)

The next series of tax ledgers, for 1940-1946, charged John W. Sutton with the \$400 house and, in 1941, a new entry showed:

Mrs. Fairy O. Sutton conveyed this property to Cecil A. and Katherine H. Richardson in 1960. (4) Sixteen years later, Mrs. Richardson conveyed to Carl J. Yarema and Eleanor McGinnis Yarema in a deed that still referenced such 19th Century landmarks as "a stone marked 'M' No. 1 set up on the south side of the road leading from Spindle 's Meeting House [to] Merryman's Tavern and on the West side of the Baltimore and York Turnpike Road." 
