The Leight-Danmyer Bungalow is a 1½ -story wood frame bungalow constructed on a concrete wall foundation. The rectangular-plan building measures three by four bays and has asymmetrical fenestration. The side-gable roof is clad by composition shingles and the house is clad by wood drop siding. Windows in the house include metal double-hung sash (1/2 lights) and wood double-hung sash (6/1 lights). Typical bungalow features include a large shed dormer facing York Road, knee braces, and battered porch posts on rock-faced concrete pier. There is a detached garage on the northern portion of the property that has been converted to an apartment residence. Alterations and additions to the house include a wood deck on the south side and rear of the house.

The house was built ca. 1929 by local builder Emory C. Leight for owner Daniel Leight. A common early twentieth century house type, there are no significant distinguishing features in this building and its original fabric has been changed by additions and alterations. This property appears to be not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.



This is a fairly ordinary bungalow, but old enough to list in a town survey, apparently built in 1929 or shortly thereafter by Daniel F. and Caroline M. Leight. It is an ordinary structure of frame, 1-½ stories, its top dwelling space expanded by a large shed dormer. The main roof continues toward the front of the house to shelter a recessed porch. The porch roof supports are tapering, hollow, square posts supported by square stone piers. The lower story is covered with clapboard, the upper walls by brown wood shingles. The roof is gabled. Two post-World War II bungalows were later added to this 6-acre parcel.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Leight-Danmyer Bungalow is a sturdy but ordinary structure of 1½ stories, its upper dwelling area produced by a two-bay wide shed dormer. The house itself is three bays wide across the first-story front. The front windows are recessed under the sweeping overhang of the second-story roof. There are four square, tapering porch posts set on stone piers. The porch deck is only a step above grade. The house plan is side hall, the main door being set in the right-hand or southernmost bay.

The house is three bays deep on the first-story level, two bays at the upper level. The first story is sheathed with clapboard, but the upper level is covered with an in-fill of brown wood shingles.

Roofing is gabled. The foundation is stone. The house is aligned with the road. The other two cottages later built on this property were set well back at picturesque angles.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Leight-Danmyer Bungalow is an ordinary structure but old enough to list in doing a town survey. Located diagonally across the road from a small drive-in called "Mr. G's," it seems to have been constructed about 1929 or slightly thereafter. The ground was unimproved in May 1928 when William C. Johnson sold six acres to Caroline E. Leight. (1) (2)

The 1929 tax ledger entry for Daniel F. Leight shows him with six acres acquired from W. C. Johnson and a "New House" worth \$2,000. (3) The Leights held this house until 1971, when Mrs. Caroline E. Leight, described in the deed as a widow, conveyed all six acres to Henry A. Danmyer. (4) Two other bungalows have appeared on this tract, but they are too recent to list.


