DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Krause Park lime kiln is a stone stack or oven-like structure, built into a hillside on the east side of Old Hartford Road. The stonework and design are fairly elegant for kilns, which often have straight up-and-down walls. This kiln has a concave face and a round arch of large stones carefully set in place. The opening of the arch is 4 feet 2 inches high by 6 feet wide. The maximum distance across the curved face of the kiln is 19 feet 4 inches. The maximum width between extremities of the wing walls is 40 feet. The other surfaces of the kiln are buried in the earth mound that helps support it structurally and that provided an access route to the top where additional limestone could be dropped in through the vent to make the burning process continuous.

At the same time will be sold 7 acres 1 rood and 5 perches of Limestone Land situate about 1/4 miles from the above described property in Lime Kiln Bottom, adjoining the lands of Dr. Risteau and William Grimes, Esq. These quarries have been worked and are represented to be of the best quality. (5)

The reference<sup>f</sup> to limestone land, liming the soil, and to <sup>workable</sup> quarries, are possibly a clue to a kiln that would have come with the property.

Isaac Taylor bought the property and his home appeared nearby on Sidney's county map of 1850. (6) Taylor sold to Robert Purviance, Junior, in 1851. (7) A few months later, Purviance sold to Isaac Green of Pittsburgh. (8) Green sold to Thomas A. Lanahan in 1854. (9) Lanahan sold to Joseph Passano in 1859. (10) The Passano heirs sold to Mary A. Fastie in 1886. (11)

[ These deeds give the <sup>NAME</sup> of the ground as "Cub Hill" and "Gay's Inspection," but there is no clue to the kiln.

When Mary A. Fastie died in 1895, her inventory was taken by J. Maurice Watkins and W. Jefferson Shanklin, and the list of assets mentioned a "store room" --- presumably a one-room general store, and "1 Show Case" valued at 25 cents. Various documents show that the Fasties knew the Shanklins, who were involved in the manufacture and sale of lime, but direct proof is still lacking for the Krause kiln.
